Genre Study 3:

Argumentative Text

- Nonfiction stating the author's opinion on a topic
- Provides facts and examples to persuade the reader to agree with the author's opinion

Comprehension Skill: Author's Point of View

- Author's point of view is the author's attitude or position on a topic.
- Authors give reasons and evidence to support their points.
- Ask yourself: "What is the author's position on this topic? What clues in the text reveal this position?"

Vocabulary Strategy: Greek Roots

- Knowing the meaning of common Greek roots can help you find the meanings of unfamiliar words.
- Examples: *gen* = "race, kind" *phys* = "nature"
chron = "time"
