Genre Study 2:

Realistic Fiction

- a made-up story
- has real life characters, settings, and events
- may contain foreshadowing (hints about what will happen)

Comprehension Skill: Problem and Solution

- A story's plot is the series of events that take place in the story.
- The problem is what the characters want to do, change, or find out.
- The solution is how the problem is solved.

Vocabulary Strategy: Similes and Metaphors

- A simile compares two things by using the words *like* or *as*.
 - Example: as big as an elephant
- A metaphor is the comparison of two things without using *like* or *as*.
 - Example: the snow is a white blanket

3. encircle—to surround or form a circle around
4. express—to say or show something
5. fussy—hard to please and picky

8. whirl—to turn or spin around rapidly
